

FINAL PUBLIC NOTICE

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has received a subgrant application for the City of Marion in McDowell County. Pursuant to Executive Order 11988 and 44 CFR Part 9.12, final notice is hereby given of FEMA's intent to provide funding for this project under the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP).

An initial disaster-wide Public Notice was published Saturday, October 5, 2024 for DR-4827 Tropical Storm Helene. Under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), federal actions must be reviewed and evaluated for feasible alternatives and for social, economic, historic, environmental, legal, and safety considerations. - Executive Order (EO) 11988 and EO 11990 requires FEMA to consider alternatives - and provide a public notice of any proposed actions in or affecting floodplains or wetlands. This notice may also fulfill requirements under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA).

This notice serves as a project- specific final notice for FEMA's funding action located within a Special Flood Hazard Area. FEMA has determined the only practicable alternative is to fund the purchase and installation of generators for the sites below that were located within the Special Flood Hazard Area prior to the event. Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions. This action complies with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) requirements.

All Panels effective 10/2/2008. Sites are located in a special flood hazard area. Sites are not located within or adjacent to wetlands.

Proposed Work and Purpose: Purchase and installation of one 200KW and one 100KW generator to ensure the continuous operation of the sites listed above to provide critical services to the community in the event of a power disruption. One generator will serve to ensure security in the water supply for the entire City of Marion water system and all customers. One generator will serve a wastewater lift station providing service to Marion Correctional Institution, reducing strain on the City's wastewater system in the event of a power outage and securing the safety and health for Prison inmates and staff.

Project Alternatives: (Below are examples – adjust as needed)

- (1) *Purchase of a portable generator* – Purchasing a portable generator is not a feasible alternative as these generators must be deployed during a power outage, which relies on human intervention and can lead to delays depending on personnel availability and site access during the outage. Relying on this solution will not fully mitigate the risk of power outages at the sites listed above.
- (2) *No action alternative* – This alternative is not feasible as it is critical to ensure continuous operation of these facilities in the event of a power outage. With the no action alternative, continued negative impacts may be experienced.
