SECTION 13. FINDING OF DISENGAGE.

S E C T I O N 12. F I N D I N G O F E M E R G E N C Y.

This Ordinance is passed as an emergency measure, and the Board of Aldermen do by the vote by which this Ordinance is passed, hereby declare that a national emergency exists, which makes it imperative that this Ordinance shall become effective forthwith, the nature of said emergency being as follows: a state of war exists between the United States of America and Japan, Germany, and Italy, and the President of the United States has declared that an invasion or predatory incursion is threatened, and it is necessary in the furtherance of the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of this city that this Ordinance be effective immediately.

Upon duly seconded it was unanimously voted to adopt an ordinance entitled:

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT THE GATHERING OF CROWDS UPON THE SIDEWALKS AND IN THE STREETS OF THE TOWN OF MARION AND TO PROHIBIT THE SOLICITATION OR ACCEPTANCE OF ALMS OR COLLECTIONS IN ANY PUBLIC PLACE OR AT ANY PUBLIC GATHERING IN THE TOWN OF MARION.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, N. C.;

SECTION 1: That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to conduct or participate in any dance, demonstration, lecture, show, preaching, speaking, or singing service, or to play any musical instrument on the streets or sidewalks or in any public place in the Town of Marion in such a manner as might be calculated to cause crowds of persons to assemble or congregate at such places, except with the permission of the Mayor and at such place or places as may hereafter from time to time be designated by the Board of Aldermen.

SECTION 2: That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to beg, solicit, or accept any alms, offerings or collections of money or of any commodity in connection with any dance, demonstration, lecture, show, preaching, speaking or singing service, or the playing of any musical instrument on the streets or sidewalks or in any public place in the Town of Marion.

SECTION 3: The Mayor shall hereafter issue permits to any person or persons desiring to hold a public gathering at such place or places as may hereafter be designated by the Board of Aldermen in accordance with Section 1 of this ordinance in cases where he is of the opinion that the issuance of such permits and the holding of such gatherings will not unreasonably interfere with traffic upon the streets or sidewalks of the Town of Marion, and will not be dangerous or injurious to the public health and safety; PROVIDED that the issuance of a permit by the Mayor shall not be construed as authorizing the solicitation or acceptance of any offering or collection of money or any commodity at such gatherings.

SECTION 4: That all ordinances and clauses or ordinances in conflict with any of the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5: That if any part of this ordinance is held by the Supreme Court of this State, or by any other court of final jurisdiction, to be unconstitutional and void, such holding or decision shall not affect or nullify any other part of this ordinance.

SECTION 6: That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its enactment and adoption.

4. No walls, curbs, walkways, trees, shrubs or other improvements shall be made upon or placed on said premises until and unless plans for same shall have been submitted to and approved by the Cemetery Committee of the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion.

5. The grantor specifically reserves the right at all times to make reasonable rules and regulations for the burial of the dead and the care and maintenance of said premises.



Section 1. Depot or Terminal Required. All taxicabs which are operated within the corporate limits of the Town of Marion, North Carolina, or between said corporate limits to points, not incorporated, within a radius of five miles of said corporate limits, shall have a depot, or terminal, on private property and shall not be permitted to use the public streets except for the purpose of transporting, loading and unloading of passengers and their baggage.

Section 2. That any person, firm or corporation who shall violate, fail, neglect or refuse to comply with any provision of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be subject to a fine of \$50.00 or imprisonment for thirty (30) days. Each violation shall be deemed a separate offense.

Section 3. That all ordinances and clauses of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 4. The provisions of this ordinance shall become effective on and after midnight on the 31st day of December, 1943.





Upon call of the Mayor, a special meeting of the Board of Aldermen was held in the City Hall in Marion, N. C., at 8:00 o'clock P. M., on June 12, 1944.

Present: J. F. Wilkinson, Mayor, H. D. Bishop, J. F. Jonas, W. S. Shiflet, W. K. M. Gilkey, Aldermen.

Absent: S. W. Blanton, Alderman.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Wilkinson, who announced that the purpose of the meeting was to consider the granting of an exclusive franchise for the operation of motor buses on regular schedules in the Town of Marion. A large number of citizens of the Town were present, including Mr. L. C. Holland, who at this time is operating two buses on a taxi license in the city with no fixed schedule.

After a general discussion of the matter it was the concensus of opinion of all persons present that the transporation needs of the city required increased service. Whereupon the Mayor stated to Mr. L. C. Holland that in view of the fact that he was now undertaking to operate buses on Saturdays that the Board of Aldermen felt that he should be given the first opportunity to obtain an exclusive franchise for the operation of buses in the city on regular schedules each day in the week; that Messrs W. M. Shelton and L. P. Hollis, of Greenville, S. C., had advised the Board that they proposed to operate buses on a thirty minute schedule and that if granted a franchise they would do so. Mr. Holland then stated that he would not be interested at all in obtaining such a franchise; that he did not have and could not obtain sufficient equipment, and that even if he did have, or could get, sufficient buses, that he still would not be interested in obtaining such a franchise. Whereupon, upon motion duly made and seconded, it was unanimously ordered that an exclusive franchise for the operation of motor buses in the Town of Marion be granted to Messrs. W. M. Shelton and L. P. Hollis, provided satisfactory terms and conditions could be agreed upon, and the Mayor was authorized to appoint a committee to negotiate with said Shelton and Hollis and to report back at the next meeting of this Board.

Upon motion duly seconded, it was voted to build three concrete tennis courts on the Community Building playgrounds, and that the Town pay all expenses above the amount of private donations received by Grayson Neal.

Upon motion duly seconded, it was voted to run a page ad in the McDowell News and Marion Progress in connection with the fifth War Loan.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

Upon motion duly seconded an Ordinance granting Franchise to W. M. Shelton and L. P. Hollis to operate Buses on, over and upon the streets and ways of the Town of Marion, North Carolina, as follows:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion duly assembled that:

SECTION 1: An exclusive franchise for the operation of trackless motor driven street buses on fixed schedules upon and along the streets of the Town of Marion be, and the same is hereby granted to W. M. Shelton and L. P. Hollis, trading and doing business as Marion City Lines.

SECTION 2: This franchise shall not be sold, transferred, assigned, pledged or hypothecated to any person, firm or corporation without the written approval and consent of the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, North Carolina.

SECTION 3: The grantees of this franchise shall pay to the Town of Marion as a privilege tax for each and every bus operated the sum of \$25.00 per year, payable in advance, and in addition thereto shall pay as franchise taxes the following percentage of the gross earnings of said bus operations:

No % for the first year.

1 % for the second year

2% for the third year and for the fourth year and every year thereafter an amount to be fixed by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, which amount shall not exceed 3%.

The said payments on the gross earnings of the grantees, above set forth, shall be payable semi-annually on June 30th and December 31st of each year, and the Board of Aldermen shall have the right to inspect and audit the books and records of the grantees for the purpose of determining the correct amount of taxes due. Provided, however, that the amount of privilege tax paid for each bus shall be applied as a credit on the franchise or percentage tax herein referred to.

SECTION 4: The term and currency of said franchise shall be for the term of 20 years after the enactment of this ordinance.

SECTION 5: That the said W. M. Shelton and L. P. Hollis, trading and doing business as Marion City Lines, shall, on or before 60 days after the date of this ordinance, put into operation upon and along the

streets of the Town of Marion, and shall thereafter continuously maintain in operation upon and along said streets, safe, adequate buses, to be approved by the Board of Aldermen, sufficient to fill the needs of public convenience and necessity, and shall operate and maintain such schedules as shall be approved by the Board of Aldermen of said Town from time to time.

SECTION 6: The fares to be charged for each person proceeding upon one continuous journey within the corporate limits upon the same bus shall not exceed the sum of ten (10 $\frac{1}{2}$) cents per trip per person. Tokens may be sold and printed tickets or cards may be sold and used upon such terms and conditions as the grantees of this franchise may determine.

SECTION 7: The buses operated under the provisions of this ordinance and the franchise herein authorized shall be subject to the same traffic regulations which are now in force in the Town of Marion with regard to the operation of motor vehicles. For the convenience of the public, the grantees, with the approval of the Board of Aldermen, may designate bus stops and give notice to the public of same by the erection of proper markers. Sufficient space shall be provided at all bus stops to allow the buses to pull into the curb, and such space shall be restricted for use of buses only, and no parking in such spaces shall be permitted. Where the Town deems necessary, it shall mark off such spaces and clearly designate that such space is for bus use only.

SECTION 8: It shall be unlawful for taxis to solicit business through any means from persons waiting at a bus stop, and taxis shall not pick up passengers from a bus stop.

SECTION 9: If the original grantees or any subsequent grantees shall fail or refuse to pay taxes herein levied when due, or to perform the requirements and conditions imposed by this ordinance and the franchise hereby granted and if such failure shall continue for a period of sixty (60) days after notice in writing given by the Town to such grantees, then and in such event, all operations hereunder shall be unlawful, and the Board of Aldermen may revoke and declare this franchise null and void, and the grantees, their agents and servants shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be subject to a fine of \$50.00 or imprisonment for thirty (30) days for each offense.

SECTION 10: The routes and schedules to be followed by the buses shall be determined by the Board of Aldermen or a committee thereof with the view to best serve the interest of the public. The location of bus stations and bus stops shall also be subject to the approval of the Board of Aldermen or a committee thereof.

SECTION 11: The grantees of this franchise shall be required to carry and maintain public liability insurance, upon each of the buses operated under this franchise, in an amount not less than \$5,000. for injury to any one person in any one accident, and not less than \$25,000.00 for injury to all persons on any one bus in any one accident, and in an amount not less than \$1,000.00 for damage to the property of any person or persons in any one accident. Said insurance shall be of a type, and shall be carried in a company or companies, to be approved by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, and same shall be filed with the Clerk and Treasurer of the Town of Marion before the commencement of operations.

SECTION 12: All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 13: Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remainder of said ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 14: This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the Board of Aldermen.

PROVIDE LIABILITY INSURANCE

WE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF MARION, N. C.:

Section 1. That pursuant to authority vested in the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, N. C., by Senate Bill No. 190 of the 1945 General Assembly, BE IT ORDAINED that all persons, firms or corporations operating taxicabs in the Town of Marion be required to provide liability insurance or other form of indemnity for injury to persons or damage to property resulting from the operation of such taxicab, in an amount of not less than \$5,000.00 to any one person and not less than \$10,000.00 for any one accident.

Section 2. That no license for the operation of any taxicab within the Town of Marion shall be issued by the Town unless and until such insurance or other form of indemnity shall be filed with and approved by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, N. C.

That any person, firm or corporation violating this ordinance, or any section thereof, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be subject to a fine of \$50.00 or imprisonment for 30 days for each offense, and each day on which any person, firm or corporation shall violate this ordinance, or any part thereof, shall constitute a separate offense.





The meeting was called to order for the purpose of considering the application made by the Montford's Cove Bus Line for a franchise from the North Carolina Utilities Commission to operate a bus line from the White House over the Montford Cove or Sugar Hill Road into the Town of Marion and thence over the streets of Marion with certain points designated as points to take on and discharge industrial workers and thence from the Town of Marion to points in and near the East Marion Mill Village and the Clinchfield Mill Village, said points being within one mile of the corporate limits of the Town of Marion and the proposed route over the streets of Marion and to the Clinchfield Mill Village and East Marion Mill Village being over the routes of a franchise heretofore granted by the Town of Marion to the Marion City Lines for the operation of buses on regular schedules for the transportation of passengers.

After a full discussion of the matter, upon motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

THAT WHEREAS, the Montford's Cove Bus Line has made application to the North Carolina Utilities Commission for a franchise over certain streets within the corporate limits of the Town of Marion and over certain streets and roads within a mile of the corporate limits of the Town and has requested permission to pick up and discharge passengers at certain designated points within the Town and within one mile thereof; and whereas, the Town of Marion has heretofore granted a franchise to the Marion City Lines for the operation of a bus service within the Town of Marion, and whereas, the application of the Montford's Cove Bus Line is for a franchise over the route now being operated by said Marion City Lines; and whereas, it is the opinion of the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion that the application of the Montford's Cove Bus Line insofar as it relates to the operation of buses within the Town of Marion and within one mile thereof is a duplication of service now being furnished by the Marion City Lines, and that it is the duty of the Town of Marion to protect the franchise heretofore granted by it to the Marion City Lines and to intervene in the application of the said Montford's Cove Bus Line and to protest the granting of any franchise by the Utilities Commission of North Carolina for the operation of bus service within the corporate limits of the Town of Marion and within one mile thereof;

BE IT, THEREFORE, RESOLVED that the Town of Marion protest the granting of a franchise by the Utilities Commission of North Carolina to the Montford's Cove Bus line insofar as such franchise would duplicate, or tend to duplicate, any bus service now being furnished by the Marion City Lines under its franchise from the Town of Marion, and the Mayor be, and he is hereby authorized and empowered to file such protest and personally appear before the Utilities Commission and take such other action as he may deem necessary to effectuate the purposes of this resolution.

Upon motion duly seconded it was voted to allow Miss Wallace to use the Community Building Saturday afternoons for a dancing class at \$3.75 per day, payable in advance.







SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, N. C., that permission be and the same is hereby granted to the Carolina Mountain Telephone Company, its successors and assigns, to construct, maintain and operate lines of telephone and telegraph, including the necessary poles, conduits, cables, fixtures and electrical conductors upon, along, under and over the public roads, streets and highways of the Town of Marion, N. C., as its business may from time to time require, provided that all poles shall be neat and symmetrical.

SECTION 2. The work of erecting poles and constructing underground conduits under this ordinance shall be done subject to the supervision of the Town, and the Company shall replace or properly relay and repair any sidewalk or street that may be displaced by reason of such work, and upon failure of the Company so to do, after twenty days' notice in writing shall have been given by the Mayor of the Town to the Company, the Town may repair such portion of the sidewalk or street that may have been disturbed by the Company, and collect the cost so incurred from the Company.

SECTION 3. In consideration of the rights and privileges herein granted, the Company, when requested by the Town, will designate and provide without cost to the Town (1) on each pole owned and used by the Company hereunder and during its ownership and use thereof, either (a) space for a fixture for, or (b) space for a cross-arm for, wires of the police and fire alarm signalling system of the Town, and (2) in each underground conduit owned and used by the Company hereunder and during its ownership and use thereof, one duct for the cables of the police and fire alarm signalling system of the Town; provided, however, that no use shall be made by the Town of said space on such poles or of said duct which will result in interfering with or impairing the operation or use of the Company's property or service, or which will endanger, damage or injure the person or property of the public or employees of the Company or Town.

Upon motion duly made and seconded an ordinance relating to regulating traffic and the use of the public streets of the Town of Marion, prescribing regulations for the installation and operation of parking meters was unanimously adopted.

On motion duly made and seconded the following Resolution was unanimously adopted:

THAT WHEREAS, on the 30th day of June, 1944, the Town of Marion granted a franchise to Marion City Lines for the operation of a bus system in and about the town of Marion, N.C., for the transportation of passengers; and whereas, the owners of said franchise, to-wit: W.M. Shelton and J.L. Gourley, partners trading and doing business as Marion City Lines, have represented to the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion that under the decision of the Supreme Court of North Carolina in the case of City Coach Company vs. Gastonia Transit Company, reported in Vol. 227 of the North Carolina Supreme Court Reports at page 391, the court has declared that a municipal corporation is without power to grant such franchise and levy any tax thereon. And that said Marion City Lines have further represented to the Board of Aldermen that if they are to continue to operate said bus system and serve the public that it is necessary that they obtain a franchise from the North Carolina Utilities Commission, and that the said Utilities Commission has advised said Marion City Lines that it will require the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion to approve the operation of buses by said Marion City Lines over the streets of the Town;

AND WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the Board of Aldermen that the interpretation by the Utilities Commission of the law as set forth in said opinion of the Supreme Court of North Carolina is not correct, and that the action of the Utilities Commission in undertaking to require the Marion City Lines to obtain a franchise from it and to require said Marion City Lines to pay a franchise tax to the State would constitute an invasion of the rights of the Town of Marion to regulate the use of its streets by said Marion City Lines;

AND WHEREAS; the Town of Marion has heretofore approved the use of its streets by said Marion City Lines the Board of Aldermen hereby reiterates said approval and specifically approves the operation of the bus system by the Marion City Lines over and upon streets in the Town of Marion, as set forth in the schedule of said Marion City Lines now on file with the Town, and further desire to go on record as stating that the operation of the bus system by the Marion City Lines is entirely satisfactory and the service now being rendered by said Marion City Lines is necessary to the public necessity and convenience of the citizens of said town.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the operation of a bus system over and upon the streets of the Town of Marion by W.M. Shelton and J.L. Gourley, partners trading and doing business as Marion City Lines, be, and the same is hereby ratified and approved. The routes, schedules and fares charged by said Marion City Lines, as now on file with the Board of Aldermen, be, and the same are specifically approved.

That nothing in this resolution shall be construed as an abandonment or waiver of the constitutional and legal rights of the Town of Marion to exclusively regulate the use of the streets of the Town by any person, firm or corporation operating a bus system for the transportation of passengers in said town, and the Board of Aldermen specifically does not recognize the right of the North Carolina Utilities Commission to regulate or in any manner interfere with operation of the buses within the Town under a franchise granted by said Town.

It was duly moved and seconded to allow Mr. Ray Epley to have a permit to sell beer in the Town of Marion.

There being no further business the Board adjourned.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO REGULATING TRAFFIC AND THE USE OF THE PUBLIC STREETS OF THE TOWN OF MARION, PRESCRIBING REGULATIONS FOR THE INSTALLATION AND OPERATION OF PARKING METERS.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, because of traffic conditions that have existed in certain sections of the Town of Marion, the free movement of traffic in those sections is, and has been, impeded for a long period of time; and

WHEREAS, attempts to regular the traffic and parking in the aforesaid areas have not been as successful as is desirable; and

WHEREAS, because of the habit of numerous operators of motor vehicles of parking for long periods of time in close proximity to other motor vehicles so parked on the most congested parts of the Town's busiest streets tends to further impede traffic and in addition thereto constitutes a danger to the life, limb and property of motorists, pedestrians and others; and

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion that the best method by which the above-mentioned conditions may be remedied is by the designation of individual parking spaces in the said ~~area~~, by providing for the use of mechanical parking-time indicators in conjunction therewith, by restricting parking in said areas to reasonable intervals of time and by compelling the operators of vehicles who enjoy the use of the parking space so designated to pay a portion of the cost of establishing and maintaining the same;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF MARION:

Section 1. For the purpose of this ordinance.

(a) The word "vehicle" shall mean any device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported upon a highway, except a device which is operated upon rails or tracks.

(b) The word "street" shall mean any public street, avenue, road, boulevard, highways or other public place located in the Town of Marion and established for the use of vehicles.

(c) The word "person" shall mean and include any individual, firm, copartnership, or corporation.

(d) The word "operator" shall mean and include every individual who shall operate a vehicle as the owner thereof or as the agent, employee or permittee of the owner.

Section 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized to establish immediately zones to be known as parking meter zones in the following streets and avenues:

On both sides of West Court Street from its intersection with Main Street to its intersection with Logan Street;

On both sides of West Henderson Street from its intersection with Main Street to its intersection with Logan Street;

On both sides of South Main Street from its intersection with Court Street to its intersection with State Street;

On both sides of North Main Street from its intersection with Court Street to its intersection with W. Fort Street.

(From the Hours of 8 A.M. to 6 P.M., Sundays excluded).

And from time to time thereafter as traffic conditions require in such other streets and avenues as are selected by resolution of the Town of Marion for the location of such zones.

And in said parking meter zones the Mayor shall cause parking meters to be installed and shall cause parking meter spaces to be designated as hereinafter provided, and shall fix the time limitation for legal parking in such zones, and the hours during the day and night when the parking meter or meters must be used and when the time limitations shall be effective, in compliance with the provisions of this ordinance; and shall indicate the time limitations by designating the same on the parking meter or meters or by appropriate signs posted in proximity to said meter or meters in said zones.

Provided, however, that the spaces or areas heretofore allotted and set aside, or which may hereafter be allotted or designated for the parking of the buses of the Marion City Lines, the Town Police cars, and the spaces and areas heretofore designated as parking spaces for the several practicing physicians of the Town of Marion, shall be exempted from the operation of this ordinance.

Section 3. The Mayor is hereby directed to provide for the purchase, acquiring, installation, operation, maintenance, supervision, regulation and use of the parking meters provided for in this ordinance, and to maintain the said meters in good workable condition, and the Mayor is hereby vested with power and authority to enter into a contract of purchase on approval of the terms and conditions thereof by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion.

Section 4. Parking meters installed in the parking meter zones established as provided in section 2 hereof shall be placed upon the curb immediately adjacent to the individual parking places hereinafter described. Each parking meter shall be placed or set in such manner as to show or display by a signal that the parking space adjacent to such meter is or is not legally in use. Each parking meter installed shall indicate by a proper legend the legal parking time established by the Town and when operated shall indicate on or by its dial and pointer the duration of the period of legal parking, and on expiration of such period, shall indicate illegal or over parking.

Section 5. The Mayor shall have lines or markings painted or placed upon the curb and/or upon the street adjacent to each parking meter for the purposes of designating the parking space for which said meter is to be used and each vehicle parking adjacent or next to any parking meter shall park within the violation of markings so established. It shall be unlawful and a violation of this ordinance to park any vehicle across any such line or marking or to park said vehicle in such position that the same shall not be entirely within the area so designated by such lines or markings.

Section 6. When a parking space in any parking meter zone is parallel with the adjacent curb or sidewalk, any vehicle parked in such parking space shall be parked with the foremost part of such vehicle nearest to such meter.

Section 7. When a vehicle shall be parked in any space adjacent to which a parking meter is located in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance, the operator of said vehicle shall, upon entering the said parking space, immediately deposit or cause to be deposited a five-cent or one-cent coin in such parking meter, and put such meter in operation, and failure to deposit such coin and put the meter in operation shall constitute a breach of this ordinance and shall subject such person to the penalty prescribed in Section 13 hereof. Upon the deposit of such coins and placing said meter in operation, the parking space may be lawfully occupied by such vehicle, during the period of time indicated by the meter. Such person may continue to remain parked in such space for such additional periods of time as he shall deposit coins in said meter and keep said meter in operation.

Section 8. It shall be unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this ordinance for any person to cause, allow, permit or suffer any vehicle registered in the name of, or operated by such person to be parked overtime.

Section 9. It shall be unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this ordinance for any person to permit any vehicle to remain or be placed in any parking space adjacent to any parking meter while said meter is displaying a signal indicating that the vehicle occupying such parking space has already been parked beyond the period of time prescribed for such parking space.

Section 10. It shall be unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this ordinance for any person to deface, injure, tamper with, open or attempt, or wilfully break, destroy, or impair the usefulness of any parking meter installed under the provisions of this ordinance. *see pg. 399*

Section 11. It shall be unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this ordinance to deposit or cause to be deposited in any parking meter, any slugs, device or metallic substance, or any other substitute, for the coins.

Section 12. It shall be the duty of police officers of the Town, acting in accordance with instructions issued by the Mayor, to report:

(a) The number of each parking meter which indicates that the vehicle occupying the parking space adjacent to such parking meter is or has been parking in violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance.

(b) The State license number of such vehicle;

(c) The time during which such vehicle is parking in violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance.

(d) Any other facts, a knowledge of which is necessary to a thorough understanding of the circumstances attending such violation. Each such police officer shall also attach to such vehicle a notice to the owner or operator thereof that such vehicle has been parked in violation of a provision of this ordinance and instructing such owner or operator to report at the Police Department of the Town of Marion in regard to such violation. Each such owner or operator may, within 24 hours of the time when such notice was attached to such vehicle, submit to the violation and pay, as a penalty for and in full satisfaction of such violation, the sum of \$1.00. The failure of such owner or operator to make such payment of said amount, within said 24 hours, shall render such owner or operator subject to the penalties hereinafter provided for violation of the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 13. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance and any person who aids, abets or assists therein, shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of any amount not exceeding \$5.00 for each offense.

Section 14. The specified coin to be deposited in parking meters as provided herein are hereby levied and assessed as fees to provide for the proper regulation and control of traffic upon the public streets, and also the cost of supervision and regulating the parking of vehicles in the parking meter zones

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AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE PLATTING AND RECORDING OF SUBDIVISIONS OF LAND IN THE TOWN OF MARION AND WITHIN ONE MILE OF THE CORPORATE LIMITS THEREOF AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF ANY OF ITS PROVISIONS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Marion, North Carolina, as follows:

Section I.

From the effective date of this ordinance, no property within the Town of Marion, or within a mile of the corporate limits thereof, shall be subdivided and offered for sale, or the plat recorded without first submitting to the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion a blue print of the plat of the property showing the proposed new streets and the existing streets, and without obtaining from the Board of Aldermen the approval of such plat; provided, that this section shall not apply to sales and deeds in accordance with plats which have already been

made and are now on file in the office of the Register of Deeds at the time this ordinance becomes effective, unless the lands shown on such existing and recorded plat are further subdivided or the streets shown thereon are changed after the effective date of this ordinance and are conveyed in accordance with the new subdivision.

Section II.

The blue prints shall be made from a clear ink line tracing, one of which shall, after approval by the Board of Aldermen, be filed with the Town Clerk as a permanent record of the town, and one filed for record with the Register of Deeds of McDowell County, North Carolina.

Section III.

The survey and plat shall be made under the supervision of a surveyor or engineer licensed to practice in the State of North Carolina, and there shall appear in the lower left hand corner of the blue print of said plat the official seal of such licensed engineer or surveyor, and shall otherwise comply with the provisions of law relating to the recording of maps in McDowell County.

Section IV.

The survey shall be made accurately and in accordance with the best practice, with a modern transit and with a steel tape or chain, and shall be tied in by bearing and distance with one of the precise traverse points of the Town of Marion. Any elevations appearing on the plat must be run from one of the precise bench marks of the Town of Marion, and based on that data. All new street corners shall be marked with permanent or semi-permanent markers approved by the City Engineer, such as iron pins, pipes or stone or concrete markers.

Section V.

The plat shall show bearings and distances of all street lines, length of tangents, radii, arcs, and chords, and central angles for all curves, street widths at intersections, easements and their widths, building lines with the distance of the set back from the property lines indicated, all land marks of a permanent character, such as stones, pipes, etc., water courses and ditches and must show all existing streets, alleys or public roads within 100 ft. of the boundaries of the proposed subdivision. The plat shall be platted accurately to one of the following scales: 1 inch - 20 feet, 1 inch-30 feet, 1 inch-40 feet, 1 inch-50 feet, 1 inch-100ft.

No proposed major or traffic street shall be less than seventy feet in width between property lines, and no proposed new minor or residence street shall be less than fifty feet between property lines, no proposed new alley shall be less than feet between property lines. The width between proposed curbs for paving shall not be indicated on the plat but shall be determined and approved by the Board of Aldermen.

The title shall appear in one corner of the plat and shall give the name of the subdivision, scale of plat, name of licensed engineer or surveyor under whose supervision the plat was prepared, the date and such additional information as might appear to be necessary, including the magnetic variation.

Section VI.

The plat, after the same has been finally approved by the Board of Aldermen, shall be recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of McDowell Cty., North Carolina, in the proper book or books, for the recording of maps and blue prints.

Section VII.

Any person violating this ordinance or any part thereof shall, upon conviction, pay a fine of \$50.00 and each day's violation shall constitute a separate and distinct offense, and any person who shall sell or exchange or offer for sale or exchange any real property situated in the Town of Marion, or within one mile of the city limits thereof, which has been subdivided, in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined the sum of \$50.00.

Further, it shall be unlawful for any surveyor, civil engineer or other person to survey or plat a subdivision of real property lying within the Town of Marion or within one mile of the corporate limits thereof or make a plat, tracing or drawing thereof without conforming to the provisions of this ordinance in respect thereto, and any such surveyor, civil engineer or any other person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined the sum of \$25.00.

Section VIII.

The invalidation of any provision or part of this ordinance shall not be deemed the invalidation of the remainder of this ordinance, it being the intent of the Board of Aldermen that such parts thereof which are valid would have been adopted without respect to the validity of such parts as may be declared to be invalid.

Section X.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its publication.
