




Upon motion duly made and seconded it was ordered that the Marion Bus lines be demanded to pay 3% of Gross receipts as per contract.

AN ORDINANCE TO PROTECT AND SAFEGUARD THE HEALTH
OF THE CITIZENS OF THE TOWN OF MARION, NORTH CAROLINA

THAT WHEREAS INFANTILE paralysis has reached an epidemic state in numerous counties of the State, and particularly in some counties adjoining the County of McDowell; and whereas the State Board of Health has recommended to the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion that it take steps to prevent all children under fifteen (15) years of age from congregating in public places or attending public or private places of business or entertainment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF MARION, NORTH CAROLINA:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any child under fifteen (15) years of age to congregate upon the streets of Marion or to enter in or attend any place of amusement, church, or other public or private place of business where people congregate, including playgrounds, baseball games, picture shows or any such place whatsoever.

Section 2. That it shall be unlawful for any parent, guardian or other person having the custody of any child under fifteen years of age to permit or allow any such child to violate the provisions of Section 1 of this ordinance.

Section 3. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to permit or allow any child under fifteen years of age to enter any such place of business or entertainment or to encourage, aid or abet any such child in violating the provisions of Section 1 of this ordinance.

Section 4. Provided, however, that nothing contained in this ordinance shall make it unlawful for such child to appear upon the streets of Marion, or to enter in any store or place of business other than theaters, churches, ball parks and playgrounds, provided such child is so doing shall not congregate with other children.

Section 5. That any person, firm or corporation violating any of the foregoing provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be subject to a fine of fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, or imprisonment for thirty (30) days for each such offense.

Section 6. That all ordinances and clauses of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 7. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the 19th day of July 1948, and shall remain in force and effect for a period of sixty (60) days, unless sooner repealed, it being the intention of the Board to repeal this ordinance just as soon as such action is recommended by the health authorities.

RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY THE TOWN OF MARION

WHEREAS, under Section 203 of the Revenue Act of 1939 as amended, persons or corporations engaged in the business of furnishing electricity, electric lights, current, power, gas or water, sewerage services, or street railway, street bus, or similar street transportation service, pay to the State of North Carolina a franchise or privilege tax of 6% of the Gross receipts from such business within this State, including the business done within the boundaries of municipalities; and

Whereas, the municipalities in large measure bear the total cost of maintaining the streets within the municipalities, which burden has materially increased thereby imposing a heavy tax on the residents of the municipalities and

Whereas, the collection by the State of North Carolina for said tax on gross receipts is a discrimination against municipalities which do not supply the aforesaid commodities or services, in that residents of these municipalities supplying these commodities or services are either relieved of the equivalent of this tax or such municipalities retain this equivalent for the use of the municipalities;

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the City Council (Board of Aldermen) of the Town of Marion that the Advisory Budget commission of the State of

North Carolina is requested to recommend, and the General Assembly of the State of North Carolina is requested to provide, that out of the tax of 6½ of gross receipts levied by Section 203 of the Revenue Act of 1939 as amended 3½ of said gross receipts from the sale within any municipality of the commodities or services described in said section shall be distributed to such municipality.

Read, Approved, and unanimously adopted by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, this 7 day of September, 1948.

The Regular monthly meeting of the Board of Aldermen was held in the Mayor's office on the above date with the following members present, to-wit: J. W. Streetman, Jr., Mayor, C. Frank Goldsmith, M. W. Gordon, Jr., Otis L. Broyhill and J. Pat Davis, Members, present. Absent Joe L. Noyes, Member.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved and the following proceedings were had to-wit:

UPON motion duly made and seconded it was unanimously ordered that the Board authorize Mr. Robert W. Proctor, City Attorney to negotiate a settlement with W. H. Hawkins regarding the payment of Street assessments on Crawford-Morgan Streets, also his claim against the Town for damages in the construction of said Crawford Street. Mr. Proctor to report the settlement to Town Board.

The Board ordered the Town Clerk to advertise the delinquent 1948 Real Estate taxes for four weeks beginning May 23 and extending through June 18th, sale date June 20, 1949.

On motion duly made and seconded the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH THE OFFICE OF TOWN MANAGER IN THE TOWN OF MARION, NORTH CAROLINA.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, North Carolina:

Section 1. Pursuant to the authority of Section 160-9 of the General Statutes of North Carolina granting the Board of Aldermen power to appoint such officers and agents as may be necessary to enforce their ordinances and regulations, keep their records, and conduct their affairs, and pursuant to Section 8 of Chapter 291 of the Private Laws of 1909, an Act amending and consolidating the Charter of the Town of Marion, North Carolina, the Board of Aldermen shall appoint an officer whose title shall be "Town Manager" and who shall be the head of the administrative branch of the Town government, except as otherwise provided by the Charter of the Town. The Town manager shall be chosen by the Board of Aldermen solely on the basis of his executive and administrative qualifications with special reference to his actual experience in, or his knowledge of, accepted practice in respect to the duties of his office as hereinafter outlined. At the time of his appointment he need not be a resident of the city or state, but during his tenure of office he shall reside within the city. No person elected to membership on the Board of Aldermen shall, subsequent to such election, be eligible for appointment as Town Manager until one year has elapsed following the expiration of the term for which he was elected.

Section 2. The Town manager shall be appointed for an indefinite term but may be removed by a majority vote of the members of the Board of Aldermen. The manager may within four days demand written charges, or a written statement,

of the reasons for removal, which the Board of Aldermen shall furnish to the manager within ten days after the filing of such request. During this period, the manager may be suspended from office with pay. The action of the Board in removing the manager shall be final.

Section 3. Responsibility of Manager - Powers of appointment and Removal.
The town manager shall be responsible to the Board of Aldermen for the proper administration of all affairs of the city placed in his charge, and to that end, subject to the provisions of the city charter and except as otherwise provided herein, he shall have the power to appoint and remove all officers and employees in the administrative service of the town, except, however, the town manager shall have no authority or jurisdiction over the police force of the town, which shall be and remain as it now is, under the sole jurisdiction of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen; but the manager may authorize the head of a department or office responsible to him to appoint and remove subordinates in such department or office. Appointments made by, or under the authority of, the town manager shall be on the basis of executive and administrative ability and of the training and experience of such appointees in the work which they are to perform. All such appointments shall be without definite term unless for provisional, temporary, or emergency service.

Section 4. Removal of Officers and Employees. Any officer or employee to whom, the town manager, or head of a department or office, may appoint a successor, may be removed by the manager or other appointing officer at any time, provided, however, that the town manager shall promptly inform the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen of any action taken under this section of this ordinance and the reasons therefor.

Section 5. Board of Aldermen not to interfere in appointments or removals. Neither the Board of Aldermen nor any of its committees or members shall direct the appointment of any person to, or his removal from, office by the town manager of any of his subordinates, or in any manner take part in the appointment or removal of officers and employees in the administrative service of the town. Except for purpose of inquiry, the Board of Aldermen and its members shall deal with the administrative service solely through the town manager, and neither the Board of Aldermen nor any member thereof shall give orders to any subordinate of the Town manager either publicly or privately.

Section 6. Duties of the Manager. It shall be the duty of the Town manager to act as Director of Finance and Purchasing Agent; to supervise the administration of the affairs of the town; to make such recommendations to the Board of Aldermen concerning the affairs of the town as may seem to him desirable; to keep the Board of Aldermen advised of the financial condition and future needs of the town; to prepare and submit to the Mayor the annual budget estimate; to prepare and submit to the Board of Aldermen such reports as may be required by that body; and to perform such other duties as may be required of him by ordinance or resolution of the Board of Aldermen.

Section 7. Compensation. The town manager shall receive such compensation as the Board of Aldermen shall fix from time to time by ordinance or resolution.

WHEREAS, numerous petitions have been received by the Board of Aldermen requesting the repeal of all ordinances prohibiting the playing of baseball in the Town of Marion on Sunday; and whereas, numerous petitions have been filed with the Board petitioning it not to permit the playing of baseball on Sunday;

AND WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen is unable to determine from the petitions the wishes of the majority of the voters of the Town of Marion, and whereas, the members of the Board of Aldermen, before acting on the matter, would like to know the wishes of the majority of the voters of the Town on this question, and after full discussion and consideration of the matter the Board is of the opinion that in the working of the democratic form of government the people should be entitled to express themselves and a referendum on

the question will enable this Board to know and determine the wishes of the citizens of the Town;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion:

That a referendum election be held in the Town of Marion on Tuesday, June 28th, 1949, at which time there shall be submitted to the voters of the Town the following proposition:

FOR SUNDAY BASEBALL
AGAINST SUNDAY BASEBALL

Mr. B. B. Byrd is hereby appointed Registrar and Mr. John Snoddy and Mr. C. Harry McCall Judges of the election.

THE TOWN HALL is hereby designated as the polling place. All citizens of the Town now duly registered and who are qualified voters shall be entitled to vote in said referendum and need not register. The registration books will be opened for the registration of electors not already registered on Saturday June 11th, 1949, and will close Saturday, June 25th, MONDAY June 27th is Challenge Day.

The City Hall is designated as the polling place and the polls shall be open at 6:30 A.M. and close at 6:30 P.M.

The results of the referendum shall be determined by the majority of votes cast. No markers or absentee votes shall be allowed. The laws, rules and regulations governing an election and Board of Aldermen shall apply as nearly as practicable, to the conduct of the referendum.

That this resolution be published in the Marion Progress and McDowell News three (3) times beginning with the issue of June 9, 1949.

AN ORDINANCE TO SET UP AND REGULATE A SCHEDULE B
DISCENSE TAX IN THE TOWN OF MARION, NORTH CAROLINA

TO BE ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF MARION,
NORTH CAROLINA:

Section 1. Definitions. Wherever in this ordinance the words hereinafter defined or construed in this section are used, they shall, unless the context requires otherwise, be deemed to have the following meaning: (a) Agent- The person having the agency for the manufacturer, producer or distributor. (b) Business- Any business, trade, occupation, profession, avocation or calling of any kind, subject, by the provision of this ordinance, to a license tax. (c) Engaged in the business. -Engaged in the business as owner or operator. (d) Fiscal year- The period beginning with the 1st day of July and ending with the 30th day of June next following. (e) Person- Any person, firm, partnership, company or corporation. (f) Quarter- Any 3 consecutive months.

Section 2. License tax upon certain trades and business operations. In addition to the tax on property and polls, as otherwise provided for, and under the power and authority conferred in the laws of North Carolina, there shall be levied and collected annually, or oftener, where provided for, a privilege license tax on trades, professions, agencies, business operations, exhibitions, circuses and all subjects authorized to be licensed, as set out in the following sections and schedule. All licenses shall be a personal privilege and shall not be transferable. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent the Board of Aldermen from imposing from time to time, as they may see fit, such license taxes as are not specifically herein defined, or from increasing or decreasing the amount of any special license tax, or from prohibiting or regulating the business or acts licensed, and all licenses are granted subject to the provisions of existing ordinances for those thereafter enacted.

Section 3. Unlawful to conduct business without a license. It shall be unlawful for any person or his agent or servant to engage in or carry on a business in the Town of Marion, North Carolina for which there is required a license, without first having paid the license tax and obtained the license. For the purpose of this section the opening of a place of business, or offering to sell, followed by a single sale or the doing of any act or thing in furtherance of the business shall be construed to be engaging in or carrying on such business; and each day that such person, firm or corporation shall engage in or carry on such business as aforesaid, shall be construed to be a separate offense.

Section 4. License taxes shall be for 12 months. All taxes provided for and fixed in the following sections and schedule shall be for 12 months, unless otherwise specified, and shall so remain for each year to come until changed by the Board of Aldermen. All the licenses provided for shall date from the 1st day of July of each and every year and shall expire on the 30th day of June of each year; Provided, that where the license is issued after January 1st, then the licensee shall be required to pay one-half the tax prescribed, except where otherwise specifically provided for.

Section 5. License required for every separate business. The payment of any particular tax imposed by this ordinance shall not relieve the person paying the same from the payment of any other tax imposed by this ordinance for any other business he may carry on, unless so provided by the section imposing such tax; it being the intent of this ordinance that license taxes prescribed by various sections or subsections of this ordinance applicable to any business shall be cumulative except where otherwise specifically provided.

Section 6. License required for every place of business. A license issued for the privilege of conducting a business is only valid for the business conducted at the place and by the licensee named therein. Every person doing business in more than one factory, mill, warehouse, store, stall or stand, or other place of business, shall secure a separate license for each such place of business, unless such places of business are contiguous to each other, communicate directly with and open into each other, and are operated as a unit. If the business is moved or if the licensee sells to another, then a new license is necessary, unless a special permit to continue business under the original license is obtained from the Board of Aldermen.

Section 7. License must be displayed at place of business licensed; exception. Every license must be kept prominently displayed at the place of business of the licensee named in the license, or, if the licensee has no fixed place of business, such licensee must keep the same wherever such business is being operated and where it can be inspected at any time by the proper municipal official.

Section 8. No abatement of license tax. No license tax shall be abated nor shall any refund of any part thereof be made, in any case where the licensee discontinues his business before the end of the period for which such license was issued.

Section 9. Schedule of license taxes. On the following trades, professions, agencies, business operations, and other subjects herein set out, the following taxes shall be levied and collected and every person engaged in any business not specifically taxed herein and not exempt by state law or by ordinance shall pay a license tax of \$25.00 per year. Advertising \$7.50, Antique Furniture \$10.00, Auction Sales (court order) \$12.50, maximum \$7.50, Banks (Industrial) \$50.00, Barber Shops \$2.00 per chair, Beauty Shops \$2.00 per operator, Bicycle dealers \$10.00, Blacksmith Shops \$5.00, Bondsmen \$15.00, Book Stores \$10.00, Bottlers \$42.50, Bowling Alleys \$10.00 per alley, Building Materials \$25.00, Cafes and Lunch Stands 30¢ per seat, Chain Stores \$50.00, Cigars, Cigarettes and Tobacco \$5.00, Clothing Stores \$20.00, Coal and Coke Dealers - retail \$15.00, wholesale \$35.00, Cold Storage Plants or Freezer Lockers \$25.00, Confectionary and Fruit Stands \$10.00, Contractors and Construction Companies \$10.00, Creameries or Dairies \$25.00, Department Stores \$30.00, Drug Stores \$10.00, Dry Cleaners and Pressing Clubs \$12.50, Express Companies \$20.00, Florists \$10.00, Foundry and Machine Shops \$15.00, Gasoline, Benzine, or other similar products Dealers \$25.00, Grocery Stores \$10.00, Hardware Stores \$25.00, Harvesting and Agricultural Machinery \$25.00, Horse and Mule Dealers \$12.50, Hotels, Tourists Courts or Motels \$1.00 per room, Ice Cream Dealers - retail \$2.50, wholesale \$6.25, Jewelry Stores- new jewelry \$15.00, jewelry and watch repairs \$5.00, Laundries in town \$25.00, out of town \$12.50, Loan Agencies \$100.00, Machinery Dealers \$25.00, Music Machines \$5.00, Weighing Machines \$1.25, Monument Dealers \$25.00, News Dealers \$10.00, Newspaper Publishers \$15.00, Office Supplies \$5.00, Painting Contractors \$7.50, Photographers \$25.00, Photograph Engravers \$10.00, Plumbers and Heating Contractors and Electricians \$7.50, Shoe Repair \$10.00, Soda Fountains \$5.00, Soft Drinks (bottle) \$2.50, Telegraph Companies \$10.00, Undertakers \$25.00, Upholsters and Cabinet Shops \$5.00, Word Yards \$10.00, Wholesalers \$25.00.

The Board of Aldermen met on the above date in regular monthly meeting with all members present with the exception of Joe Noyes. R. L. Proctor, town attorney, was also present.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Streetman.

A group of merchants appeared before the Board and asked the reason for increase in the business privilege license. Mayor Streetman stated to them that the Board had revised the entire schedule in order to make it more uniform and stated that the Board had tried to deal with each case so as not to work a hardship on anyone but to have the schedule more on a uniform basis. After a general discussion the Mayor told the committee that the Board would consider their cases at a later date and would notify them as to what action was taken.

John Martin asked the Board to consider condemning property on a short street running off West Court Street in order to widen the above street. The Mayor asked the Street Committee to look into this matter to see if a satisfactory agreement could be reached.

At the request of R. W. Proctor, town attorney, Linn D. Garibaldi, president of the Carolina Mountain Telephone Company, met with the Board to discuss the possibility of improving the telephone service in Marion. Mr. Garibaldi stated to the Board that his company was doing everything in their power to increase the efficiency of the system and that an automatic dial system had been on order for several months. He stated that he did not expect to have the dial system installed before September of 1950.

W. P. Elliott and a group of citizens from West Marion requested that the town take the necessary action to extend water system to West Marion. This item was discussed at some length and Mr. Elliott stated that his estimation of the cost of this extension would be in the \$65,000.00. It was brought up in the discussion that this extension would necessitate a bond issue and W. M. Gordon made a motion which was seconded by Frank Goldsmith that the Mayor appoint a committee to go to Raleigh to discuss with the local government commission the possibility of such a bond issue. Mayor Streetman appointed W. M. Gordon, Frank Goldsmith, Pat Davis and Reece Snyder on this committee.

Oscar Lee Lowery was granted a taxi driver's permit.

It was brought up that when R. W. Proctor was originally appointed town attorney that it should have been the firm of Proctor and Dameron and Mr. Proctor stated that it was his opinion all along that the firm had been appointed instead of he alone and that the town should feel free to call on he or Mr. Dameron at anytime for legal assistance.

R. W. Proctor turned in a check in the amount of \$189.81 for payment in full of street paving assessment for C. R. McCall.

Upon motion of Frank Goldsmith and seconded by Otis L. Broyhill the meeting was continued until 7 P. M. Monday night, August 8th at which time the Board would consider the 1949-50 budget and tax rate.

F. Craven Company 1- semi-streamlined Gunnison flusher \$3050.00, 1-streamlined Gunnison flusher \$3350.00, these bids were 2% 10 days, net 30 days; Interstate Equipment Company 1- semi-streamlined South Bend flusher \$2695.00, 1- streamlined South Bend flusher \$3020.00, these bids were net cash 10 days.

Streetman, Jr., Frank Goldsmith, Pat Davis, M. W. Gordon, Otis Brayhill with Joe Noyes being absent. Mr. Dameron with the firm of Proctor and Dameron was also present.

Minutes of the previous meetings were read and approved.

The proposed West Marion water extension was discussed at length and the committee that was appointed by the Mayor at a previous meeting to go to Raleigh to discuss with the Local Government Commission the possibility of issuing bonds for this undertaking, made a report. It seemed to be the feeling of the Board that it was doubtful as to whether a bond issue for this work would carry. It was decided to ask a group of interested citizens from West Marion to meet with the Board at a later date to discuss this matter further.

The proposed sewage disposal plant was discussed and it was agreed that a meeting be held at a later date with a representative from the Harwood Beebe Engineering firm and representatives from the Cross Cotton Mills and East Marion mills to discuss the possibility of mills participating in the cost of construction and to discuss the possibilities of planning for a plant in the South Section and on the North Section of Town.

The Manager stated that a representative from the Harwood Beebe Engineering firm had made recommendations for increasing the water supply and pressure at the Josephine Mill. Upon motion of M. W. Gordon, seconded by Otis Brayhill, the Manager was instructed to ask Harwood Beebe Company to submit their recommendations to the South Eastern Underwriters for their approval and that if they approved this recommendation that the Manager proceed to install the necessary water line along State Street from the Clinchfield Railroad to Avenue "A".

It was decided that as many members of the Board that could go would attend the annual Conference of the North Carolina League of Municipalities in Winston-Salem on October 19, 20, and 21st.

Upon motion of Otis Brayhill seconded by Pat Davis the Manager was instructed to lay a storm sewer line along Oak Street to High Street. This was voted unanimously with the exception of M. W. Gordon who ~~did~~ not vote as Mr. Gordon owns property in this location.

Upon motion made and duly seconded a taxi driver's license permit was issued to the following: Troy Parker, Bruce McNeil, Leonard Charles Holland, Howard Vance Ward, and Jerry Hall.

The Manager stated that Mr. B. M. Lane, Jr. of the Carolina Green's Fuel Gas Company had requested a reduction on his Business Privilege License. The Manager was instructed to notify Mr. Lane that the charge made to him was the same as to other gas companies and that no reduction would be made.

The question of Motor Freight Trucks and other Transfer Trucks double parking on the streets for the purpose of loading and unloading was discussed and also speeding on streets in Town particularly East Court Street and Rutherford Road and it was decided that the Mayor take this up with the Chief of Police and that he take the necessary action to correct these conditions.

Mayor Streetman called the meeting to order and asked for a general discussion on the proposed sewer plant. Mr. Gordon stated to the Board that he had had the Town Attorney to draw up a tentative agreement between the Town of Marion and the Clinchfield Mills whereby the Town could run not over 40 outlets in to the Clinchfield sewer plant. The agreement stated that the Town would pay to the Clinchfield Mills \$3.00 per month for each sewer connection. After a general discussion and motion by M. W. Gordon seconded by Frank Goldsmith and voted unanimously, the Mayor and the Clerk were authorized to enter into this contract with the Clinchfield Mills.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, the Manager was instructed to proceed as soon as possible to install water meters on all connections that do not now have meters.

Mr. Joe Noyes stated to the Board that the Hospital Board was considering acquiring property in the Northeast section of Town to build a new Hospital and asked the Board what their decision would be to running water and sewer and paving streets to this site. The Board went on record as supporting this project and assured Mr. Noyes that they would do anything within reason to cooperate in securing a new Hospital for the Town of Marion.

4. Any business or commercial establishment located at the intersection of two or more streets and which desires a driveway into two intersecting streets shall construct said driveways so as to comply with the minimum requirements as shown on Plates 5 and 6 according to the illustration which is most similar to the proposed construction.

5. No driveway apron shall extend out into the street further than the face of the curb and under no circumstances shall such driveway apron extend into the gutter area.

6. At all business or commercial driveway entrances a white line, not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches in width, shall be maintained along the entire width of the driveway or ramp to clearly define the sidewalk area on the property side of the sidewalk.

B. Driveways for Residences.

Amended 12-5-50: That Section One shall be changed to read 35 ft. instead of 30 ft.; that the 20 ft. minimum requirement would not be required at the at the intersection of streets as shown on Plate 6; that Section Five be entirely stricken from the ordinance; that the minimum distance from back of sidewalk or property line to pump island be a minimum of 14 ft.; that a 6 in. by 6 in. concrete curb shall be built just back of the sidewalk line or property line for the entire length of the pump island, and that if the lot in question is more than 70 ft. in width, a grass plot is required between ramps or driveways with street curb left standing.

4. Any business or commercial establishment located at the intersection of two or more streets and which desires a driveway into two intersecting streets shall construct said driveways so as to comply with the minimum requirements as shown on Plates 5 and 6 according to the illustration which is most similar to the proposed construction.

5. No driveway apron shall extend out into the street further than the face of the curb and under no circumstances shall such driveway apron extend into the gutter area.

PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A TOWN PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION FOR THE TOWN OF MARION, NORTH CAROLINA.

The Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, North Carolina do ordain as follows:

Section 1. A Town Planning and Zoning Commission for the Town of Marion, North Carolina, is hereby created under the authority of G. S. 160-177.

Section 2. The Town Planning and Zoning Commission shall consist of five members who shall be persons of recognized experience and qualifications, and shall hold no other official position.

The members shall be appointed by the Board of Aldermen upon creation of the Planning and Zoning Commission. All members of the Planning and Zoning Commission shall serve as such without compensation. Members may, after public hearing, be removed by the Mayor for inefficiency, neglect of duty, or malfeasance in office. Vacancies occurring otherwise than through the expiration of term shall be filled for the unexpired term by the Board of Aldermen.

Section 3. ORGANIZATION AND RULES. Within thirty days after appointment the Planning and Zoning Commission shall elect its chairman from among the appointed citizen members and create and fill such other offices as it may determine.

Section 4. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. It shall be the function and duty of the Planning and Zoning Commission to make and adopt a zoning plan for the control of the height, area, bulk, location, and use of buildings and premises.

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Section 5. PURPOSES IN VIEW. In the preparation of such plan the Planning and Zoning Commission shall make careful and comprehensive surveys and studies of present conditions and future growth of the municipality. The plan shall be made with the general purpose of guiding and accomplishing coordinated, adjusted, and harmonious development of the municipality and its environs which will, in accordance with present and future needs, best promote health, safety, morals, order conveniences, prosperity, and general welfare, as well as efficiency and economy in the process of development; including, among other things, adequate provision for traffic, the promotion of safety from fire and other dangers, adequate provision for light and air, the promotion of the healthful and convenient distribution of population, the promotion of good civic design and arrangement, wise and efficient expenditure of public funds, and the adequate provision of public utilities and other public requirements.

Section 6. REPEAL AND DATE OF EFFECT. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and publication as provided by law.

Section 7. VALIDITY. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remainder of said ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

Re Paving Assessments

Dear Mr. Snyder:

With further reference to my conversation with you this morning in your office, the Town of Marion turned over to me all the delinquent paving assessments in June, 1942. These assessments were the ones shown in the ledger I checked over in your office, and I have been working on these accounts ever since 1942 but according to my records I have been paid nothing for these collections since October 1, 1942, at which time I was paid \$199.93. This covered assessments which were paid directly to me. A great many of the people owing the assessments, upon receipt of my letters, made payment direct to the Town and, in many cases, came to me and agreed upon a partial-payment plan, and it was my intention to wait until substantial collections were made either by me or paid direct by the debtor before submitting bills, because a great many of the payments were for small amounts and it would be quite troublesome to keep up with otherwise. However, I have delayed from time to time in checking into this matter, but upon checking through my file which was rather voluminous and contains literally hundreds of letters written to the delinquents, I find that since I was last paid I have personally collected and paid over to the Town \$833.99, as per list of collections hereto attached, and \$2,550.78 has been paid direct by the taxpayers since the accounts were placed in my hands and, in most cases, after conferences and dealings with the individual debtors. For instance, I distinctly recall the matter of J. G. Neal and W. W. Neal. Both of these matters were compromised after I had devoted considerable time and discussion with the Neals, including going over the ground with a committee from the Board of Aldermen. A list of these collections is also shown on the schedule hereto attached.

We never had any definite understanding with the Town about fees in this matter but it has always been our practice to charge the Town considerably less than we would other clients for similar services, and formerly I have submitted bills on a basis of 10% plus reasonable suit fees where suit had to be instituted.

These collections total \$3,384.77. I had to institute suit against Charlie Barnes and had to prepare the papers for suit against the John Yancey heirs before they finally paid. Offhand, there might seem to be some distinction between the monies I actually collected and paid over to the Town and the monies paid direct by the debtors, but in practically every case we have not only written but had numerous conferences with these debtors and we know that our effort was directly responsible for the collection of these accounts.

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As stated above, it is our policy to charge the Town considerably less than we would other clients. The universal rule for attorneys' collections is 10% on collections not exceeding \$500 and we feel that a bill on that basis, plus a small suit fee in the Charlie Barnes case, would be extremely fair and reasonable, so we are enclosing statement on the basis of 10% and adding only \$11.23 suit fee in the Charlie Barnes case to make it an even \$350.

I would appreciate it if you would take this up with the Board at their next meeting and I will be glad to be present and go over it with them if they so desire.

Incidentally, this cleans up practically all of the paving assessments, which were placed in my hands for collection except Ben Hendley, in the principal amount of \$126.70, J. Will Pless, Jr., \$40.00, T. M. Finley Estate, \$21.66, and Mrs. J. S. Hopper, \$68.25. We agreed upon a settlement with Mr. Hendley and he was to pay off by the month. I will see if I can get this agreement in writing. We have a tax suit pending against Mrs. Hopper and the paving account can be handled in that suit. I will continue my efforts to collect all of these accounts.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PLACING OF SIGNS
OR BANNERS ACROSS AND OVER THE STREETS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN FOR THE TOWN OF MARION NORTH CAROLINA:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to hang, suspend or otherwise place any sign or banner over and across any of the streets of the Town of Marion, it being the purpose and intention of this ordinance to prohibit the placing of what is generally known as overhead signs or banners over and across the streets.

Section 2. Any person, firm or corporation violating this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$50.00 or imprisonment not to exceed thirty (30) days.

Section 3. That all ordinances and clauses of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This ordinance shall become effective upon its passage.

After some discussion, it was decided that these property owners would discuss this matter and contact the manager at a later date.

Bids were opened for furnishing the town with a 1-ton pick-up truck or a car. After comparing these bids, it was decided to purchase a 1950 model two-door, eight cylinder, Ford from Marion Motor Company to be used in the Police Department. This contract not to be awarded before May 5th., as stated in the advertisement, and that in the event that other bids will be submitted

that the board would reconsider this matter.

Upon motion of Joseph Noyes, seconded by Otis Broyhill, a subdivision plat of M. W. Gordon, Jr. be approved. This property is just outside the city limits.

Upon motion of Joseph Noyes, seconded by Frank Goldsmith, it was ordered that the town install street lights at the intersection of Oak and Gilkey streets; and one at the intersection of High and Oak streets.

A street paving petition for paving a portion of Maple Avenue from McDowell Avenue, approximately 700 feet, was presented, and upon motion of Joseph Noyes, seconded by Pat Davis, it was ordered that this be included in the 1950-51 budget.

I have the honor of submitting to you herewith, my estimates for the budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1950 and ending June 30, 1951. Our experiences during the past year have enabled us to make these estimates based on past experiences and some definite ideas as to what we need for the future.

During the past year, we have spent a great deal of money in the purchase of new equipment, and we feel that we are in much better condition as to our operational equipment than we have been for some years. We are, however, in need of one additional truck which has been included in this budget estimate. We have also included an amount for the purchase of a tractor for covering garbage and street work.

We believe that our estimates are fairly conservative, and at the same time, we believe that they are ample. You will note that our budget is in ~~excess~~ ^{excess} of the previous year, and we feel that this is justified by anticipated increase in revenue; however, it must be remembered that a budget is an estimate and that times and conditions can make a considerable change.

A budget is something to be watched every day. If saving can be effected, or desirable changes made, it should be done. Our people demand services, and if we can give that service at less cost than estimated, we will pledge our best efforts to do so.

Mr. Everette Carnes came before the board and stated that he represented Mr. H. D. McLean, who was interested in securing a bus franchise in the Town of Marion. After a lengthy discussion, it was decided that the Mayor and the manager discuss this with Mr. R. W. Proctor, town attorney, and then if it is found advisable, a meeting with Mr. Courley, operator of the Marion City Lines, would be called to see if arrangements could be worked out whereby Mr. Courley would put his buses in proper condition and meet regular schedules, or if other action would be advisable.

Mr. W. G. Wiatt, manager of the local Duke Power Company office, submitted a whiteway lighting contract, and a general street lighting contract for the approval of the board. Upon motion of D. Pat Davis and seconded by Clarence Wise, that the contract be approved and that a proper resolution be made part of these minutes.

M. W. Gordon, Jr. came before the board and explained in detail conferences that he had had with the officials of Gross Cotton Mills, and Marion Manufacturing Company in regards to their participating in the cost and operation of the proposed Sewage Disposal Plant and stated that even though he had resigned from the Board of Aldermen, he would be delighted to do any thing in his power towards seeing this project brought to a satisfactory completion. Grant, and unanimously voted, the following amendments were made to the ordinance, REGULATING THE CONSTRUCTION OF DRIVEWAYS, that Section One shall be changed to read 35 ft. instead of 30 ft.; that the 20 ft. minimum requirement would not be required at the intersection of streets as shown on plate 6; that Section Five be entirely stricken from the ordinance; that the minimum distance from back of sidewalk or property line to pump island be a minimum of 14 ft.; that a 6 in. by 6 in. concrete curb shall be built just back of the sidewalk line or property line ~~for the entire length of the grass plot and if no grass plot exists, that this curb be built at the same location~~ for the entire length of the pump island, and that if the lot in question is more than 70 ft. in width, a grass plot is required between ramps or driveways with street curb left standing.

The amendment to this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the above date.

Gordon, Jr. came before the Board and stated that McDowell County was ready to proceed with installing two-way radios in the County Sheriffs' automobiles and asked that if the town was still interested in installing two-way radios in Police Cars as had been discussed at earlier meetings. The Board informed Mr. Gordon that they were securing Police Radios and Mayor Goldsmith appointed the following committee to meet with representatives of the County, work out the details on this matter and advertise for bids; the committee being D. Pat Davis, C. C. Wise and Reece Snyder.

Mr. Jim Gourley and his son came before the Board representing Marion City Bus Lines at the request of the Board, to discuss ways and means to improve the present bus situation in Marion. Mr. Gourley asked Mr. R. W. Proctor, who is also the attorney for the Bus Lines, to speak for him. Mr. Proctor stated that Mr. Gourley had been for some time working under extreme hardship financially, as he was attempting to buy out a former partners interest. He also stated that Mr. Gourley was planning to take on another partner who would put some capital into the company, and that he believed after this was done that Mr. Gourley would bring his busses and bus schedules up to a satisfactory condition. Mr. Gourley stated that he felt that if the Board would grant him additional time that he would be able to make the necessary improvements. Upon motion of Mr. Grant, seconded by Mr. Wise and unanimously voted, it was decided to delay any action on this matter for at least thirty days to give Mr. Gourley an opportunity to see what arrangements could be made.

It was decided that Mr. Proctor should contact the Clinchfield Railroad and the Southern Railroad to secure permission for a grade crossing at the sewage disposal plant.

The question of preparing a new charter for the town again was discussed and the town attorney was instructed to start work on this in the near future in order that it might be completed and presented to this session of the legislature for its passage.

The manager was instructed to contact officials of the Drexel Furniture Company and Broyhill Furniture Company to find out whether or not they are dumping any inflammable liquids such as lacquer waste into an open stream.

Upon motion by D. Pat Davis, seconded by W. F. Grant and unanimously voted, the following charges on water taps and water meters was adopted; the reason for this being the increased cost of these items. These increased prices are to go into effect immediately:

3/4 in. water tap with meter included, inside city limits \$45.00.

3/4 in. tap with meter included, outside city limits \$55.00.
1 in. tap inside city limits \$25.00.
1 in. tap outside city limits \$37.50.
1 in. and larger meters to be billed at actual cost.

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE OPERATION OF BUSINESSES, INDUSTRIES, AMUSEMENTS AND RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES ON SUNDAY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, North Carolina:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to conduct, operate, carry on or engage in any business, commercialized entertainment, commercialized sports, commercialized recreation or amusement except as hereinafter provided.

Section 2. That it shall not be unlawful to engage in or conduct the business of drug stores, cafes, restaurants, hotels, tourist courts, radio stations, ice plants, public conveyances, and mortuaries.

Section 3. The following named businesses are permitted to operate on Sundays but shall remain closed and not in operation during the following hours:

Filling Stations, Grocery Stores, News Stands and Soft Drink Stands from 9:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M.; and from 7:00 P.M. to 9:00 P.M. And provided, further, that motion picture shows may be operated on Sunday only during the following hours: Between 2:00 P.M. and 5:00 P.M., and after 9:00 P.M.

Section 4. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation or association to conduct, engage in or sponsor or otherwise take part in the playing or exhibition or organized baseball or any other commercialized sport, game or recreation on Sunday, except as specifically permitted by this ordinance.

Section 5. That any person, firm or corporation violating this ordinance, or any section thereof, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be subject to a fine of \$50.00 or imprisonment for 30 days for each offense. And each day on which any person, firm or corporation shall violate this ordinance, or any part thereof, shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 6. That all ordinances, and clauses or sections of ordinances, in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 7. That if any part of this ordinance is held by the Supreme Court of this State, or by any other court of final jurisdiction, to be unconstitutional and void, such holding or decision shall not affect or nullify any other part of this ordinance.

Section 8. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its enactment and its adoption.

After a lengthy discussion, it was decided that Mr. Proctor and Mr. Snyder contact the officials of the Cross Mill to see what financial arrangement could be agreed upon. Also to contact Mr. Twitty of the Marion Manufacturing Company to reach an agreement along the same lines.

A general discussion followed on several questions but no definite action was taken on any.

Mr. H. D. McLean and his attorney's appeared before the board and discussed the possibilities of Mr. McLean obtaining the bus franchise to operate in the Town of Marion. After a lengthy discussion, it was decided to delay this matter for sometime in order that the Board would have time to find out from Mr. Gourley, the present operator of the bus lines, what he had been able to work out with reference to improving his equipment and schedules.

Upon motion of Alderman Davis and seconded by Alderman Grant, and unanimously voted, it was agreed that Messrs. E. R. Keeter, G. W. Giles, W. J. Alley, R. W. Atwell, George Smith, and C. R. McCall be retired from the active list of the fire department and that the town continue to carry and pay the life insurance on the above men. The manager stated to the Board that Mr. W. S. Jones of East Marion had requested permission to connect a 2½ or a 3 in. water line to the city system in the vicinity of the city cemetery. It was agreed that Mr. Jones be granted this permission provided he conform with the city policy.

The matter of insurance on city properties was discussed and the manager was instructed to make a study of this and report to the Board at a later date.

The Mayor and the entire Board of Aldermen filed with the Mayor their candidacy for re-election in the May 8th, 1951 City Election.

Mayor Goldsmith appointed W. Ray Smith and W. F. Grant as trustees of Firemens Relief Fund.

Hollis, trading and doing business as Marion City Lines, to operate buses over and upon the streets of the Town of Marion; and whereas, the said L. P. Hollis has heretofore sold and transferred his interest in said Marion City Lines and the holder of said franchise is now W. M. Shelton and J. L. Gourley, Sr.;

AND WHEREAS, for the past several years the Marion City Lines has failed to comply with the provisions of said franchise in that it has failed to properly maintain schedules, furnish safe and adequate buses, and has failed to pay all taxes to the Town of Marion, as provided in the said franchise;

AND WHEREAS, on December 12, 1950 the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion caused written notice to be sent by registered mail to the said W. M. Shelton and the said J. L. Gourley, which said letter was delivered to each of said partners on December 13, 1950, said letter notifying said partners to be and appear before the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, North Carolina on January 2, 1951 and show cause, if any they had, why said franchise should not be revoked on account of the poor service rendered by the bus company and the failure to provide reasonably safe and adequate buses;

AND WHEREAS, at said hearing the said J. L. Gourley appeared and the said W. M. Shelton failed to appear; and whereas, said hearing was continued at the request of the said J. L. Gourley, who assured the Board of Aldermen that the Marion City Lines would remedy the conditions complained of and would, within sixty days of said hearing, provide new and adequate equipment and would promptly meet all schedules and would remedy the sanitary condition of the buses;

AND WHEREAS, the Marion City Lines has failed to remedy the conditions complained of, as hereinabove set forth, and is still operating inadequate and unsafe buses;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the hearing heretofore continued be set for Tuesday, May 22, 1951 at 7:30 P. M. at the Mayor's office in the Town of Marion, North Carolina, and that W. M. Shelton and J. L. Gourley be notified of said hearing and notified to be and appear before the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, North Carolina, and then and there show cause, if any they have, why the franchise heretofore granted Marion City Lines should not be revoked for the reasons hereinabove set forth.

The Town Attorney and the Manager were instructed to prepare Right of Way easement contracts to cover Right of Way on Sewer Lines to the proposed Sewage Disposal Plant, and it was agreed that as soon as this was done, members of the Board would contact the various property owners to obtain said Right of Way.

and trash in unused rooms, and it was further ordered that the building should be made to comply with, in all cases, the North Carolina Building Code.

complaints from citizens relative to cars parking on sidewalks at Service Stations to be serviced.

The Mayor announced that this meeting had been called primarily for the purpose of considering the matter of the revocation of the franchise heretofore granted by the Town of Marion to the Marion City Lines, a partnership now composed of W. M. Shelton and J. L. Gourley, pursuant to resolution adopted by the Board of Aldermen on the 8th day of May, 1951 requiring said Shelton and Gourley to be and appear before the Board at this time and show cause, if any they had, why said franchise should not be revoked. It appearing to the Board of Aldermen and the Board finding as a fact that a certified copy of said resolution was mailed to each of said partners on May 11, 1951 by registered mail and delivered to each of them on the 12th day of May 1951.

Mr. J. L. Gourley was present in person; Mr. W. M. Shelton was not present and was not represented by counsel. Mr. Gourley stated that although he had done his best, he had been unable to correct the conditions complained of by the Board of Aldermen and had been unable to obtain new equipment and could give no assurances that he would be able to correct the conditions complained of in the near future;

WHEREUPON the Board of Aldermen, after full consideration of the matter, by motion duly seconded, unanimously adopted the following resolution:

"THAT WHEREAS, on the 30th day of June, 1944 the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, North Carolina granted a franchise to W. M. Shelton and L. P. Hollis, trading and doing business as Marion City Lines, to operate buses over and upon the streets of the Town of Marion; and whereas, the said L. P. Hollis has heretofore sold and transferred his interest in said Marion City Lines and the holder of said franchise is now W. M. Shelton and J. L. Gourley, Sr.;

AND WHEREAS, for the past several years the Marion City Lines has failed to comply with the provisions of said franchise in that it has failed to properly maintain schedules, furnish safe and adequate buses, and has failed to pay all taxes on the Town of Marion, as provided in the said franchise;

AND WHEREAS, on December 12, 1950 the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion caused written notice to be sent by registered mail to the said W. M. Shelton and the said J. L. Gourley, which said letter was delivered to each of said partners on December 13, 1950, said letter notifying said partners to be and appear before the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, North Carolina on January 2, 1951 and show cause, if any they had, why said franchise should not be revoked on account of the poor service rendered by the bus company and the failure to provide reasonably safe and adequate buses;

AND WHEREAS, at said hearing the said J. L. Gourley appeared and said W. M. Shelton failed to appear; and whereas, said hearing was continued at the request of the said J. L. Gourley, who assured the Board of Aldermen that the Marion City Lines would remedy the conditions complained of and would, within sixty days of said hearing, provide new and

adequate equipment and would promptly meet all schedules and would remedy the sanitary condition of the buses;

AND WHEREAS, the said W. M. Shelton and J. L. Gourley were duly notified to be and appear before this Board at this meeting; and whereas, the said W. M. Shelton failed to appear and the said J. L. Gourley has failed to show any cause why said franchise should not be revoked;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Marion City Lines, a partnership composed of W. M. Shelton and J. L. Gourley, has failed to provide reasonably safe and adequate bus transportation for the public; has failed to comply with the terms and provisions of the franchise heretofore granted by said Town, and said partnership has also had ample notice and ample time in which to provide adequate and safe transportation but it has failed to do so, and the Board of Aldermen finds as a fact that the interest of the public requires that said franchise be revoked.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that the franchise heretofore granted to said Marion City Lines be and the same is hereby revoked as of June 1, 1951. AN ORDINANCE GRANTING FRANCHISE TO
MARION TRANSPORTATION COMPANY, A
CORPORATION ORGANIZED AND EXISTING
UNDER AND BY VIRTUE OF THE LAWS OF
THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA, TO
OPERATE BUSES ON, OVER AND UPON THE
STREETS AND WAYS OF THE TOWN OF
MARION, NORTH CAROLINA

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of
the Town of Marion, duly assembled, that:

SECTION 1: An exclusive franchise for the operation of
trackless motor-driven street buses on fixed schedules upon and
along the streets of the Town of Marion be, and the same is here-
by granted to Marion Transportation Company, a corporation or-
ganized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State
of North Carolina.

SECTION 2: This franchise shall not be sold, trans-
ferred, assigned, pledged or hypothecated to any person, firm or
corporation without the written approval and consent of the
Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, North Carolina.

SECTION 3: The grantee of this franchise shall pay
to the Town of Marion as a privilege, franchise and license tax,
for each and every bus operated, the sum of \$50.00 per year, pay-
able in advance.

SECTION 4. The term and currency of said franchise
shall be for the term of 20 years after the enactment of this
order.

SECTION 5. That the said Marion Transportation Company
shall, on or before the 1st. day of June, 1951, put into operation
upon and along the streets of the Town of Marion, and shall there-
after continuously maintain in operation upon and along said
streets, safe, adequate buses, to be approved by the Board of
Aldermen, sufficient to fill the needs of public convenience and
necessity, and shall operate and maintain such schedules as shall
be approved by the Board of Aldermen of said Town from time to
time. Said buses are to be maintained in a clean, safe and com-
fortable manner for passengers riding therein, and shall be
cleaned daily, both inside and outside.

SECTION 6: The fares to be charged for each person
for one continuance journey upon the same bus shall not exceed
the sum of Ten (10¢) Cents per trip per person; provided, how-
ever, that the fare for transporting children to and from school
shall not exceed Five (5¢) Cents per person. Tokens may be sold
and printed tickets or cards may be sold and used upon such terms
and conditions as the grantee of this franchise may determine.

SECTION 7: The buses operated under the provisions of
this ordinance and the franchise herein authorized shall be sub-
ject to the same traffic regulations which are now in force in
the Town of Marion with regard to the operation of motor vehicles.
For the convenience of the public, the grantee may, subject to
the approval of the Board of Aldermen, designate bus stops and
give notice to the public of same by the erection of proper
markers. Sufficient space shall be provided at all bus stops
to allow the buses to pull into the curb, and such spaces shall
be restricted for use of buses only, and no parking in such spaces
shall be permitted. Where the Town deems necessary, it shall mark
off such spaces and clearly designate that such space is for bus
use only.

SECTION 8: It shall be unlawful for taxis to solicit
business through any means from persons waiting at a bus stop,
and they shall not pick up passengers from a bus stop.

SECTION 9: If the original grantee or any subsequent
grantee or grantees shall fail or refuse to pay taxes herein
levied when due, or to perform the requirements and conditions
imposed by this ordinance and the franchise hereby granted, and
if such failure shall continue for a period of sixty (60) days
after notice in writing given by the Town to such grantee, then
and in such event, all operations hereunder shall be unlawful,
and the Board of Aldermen may revoke and declare this franchise
null and void, and the grantee, its agents and servants, may be
prosecuted criminally in the Mayor's Court of the Town of Marion.

SECTION 10: The routes to be followed by the buses
shall be determined by the Board of Aldermen or a committee

(a) That it is necessary to issue all of the \$400,000 Sanitary Sewer Bonds authorized by an ordinance passed on February 26, 1951, which ordinance was approved by the vote of a majority of the qualified voters of said Town who voted at an election duly called and held on April 3, 1951.

(b) That none of said bonds has heretofore been issued and that no notes have been issued in anticipation of the sale of any of said bonds.

(c) That the probable period of usefulness of the enlargements to the sanitary sewer system to be made from the proceeds of said bonds is a period of forty years from February 26, 1952, being a date not more than one year after the passage of said ordinance, and that such period expires on February 26, 1992.

Section 2. That for the purpose provided in said ordinance there shall be issued the negotiable coupon bonds of the Town of Marion in the aggregate principal amount of \$400,000, designated "Sanitary Sewer Bonds", consisting of 400 bonds of the denomination of \$1,000 each, numbered 1 to 400, inclusive, dated June 1, 1951, maturing annually, June 1, in numerical order, lowest numbers first, \$20,000 1954 to 1973, inclusive, without option of prior payment, and bearing interest at a rate or rates not exceeding 6% per annum to be determined by the Local Government Commission at the time the bonds are sold, which interest shall be payable semi-annually on the first days of June and December of each year, both the principal of and the interest on said bonds to be payable at the Chase National Bank of the City of New York, in the Borough of Manhattan, City and State of New York, in any coin or currency

The Manager was instructed to install parking meters near the McCall Funeral Home and Westmoreland-Hawkins Funeral Home and to leave one parking space on Main Street near the corner at each of the funeral homes, this free parking space to be designated "reserved for funeral home."

Upon motion of Alderman Smith, seconded by Alderman Davis, the recommendations of the Manager in regard to the Police Department were approved, the recommendations being that the starting salary for police officers be \$180.00 per month, to add one police, making a total of nine including the Chief and to put the Police Department on the eight-hour work day.

Bids were opened on furnishing an automobile to the Town, and the bid was awarded to Marion Motors, Inc. for a hundred ten horsepower Ford Police Special, the net price being \$1,000.00. Other bids submitted were net price on a hundred horse-power Ford V-8 Ford \$1,100.00 and a bid from Snipes Motor Company for a Dodge Wayfarer 6-Cylinder, net amount bid \$1,473.25. All of the bids included a trade-in of a 1946 Model Ford.

Upon motion of Alderman Wise, seconded by Alderman Broyhill, and unanimously voted, the 1950-51 budget and privilege license ordinances were officially adopted and the tax rate set of \$1.45 on the \$100.00 valuation, a copy of which is attached to these minutes.

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING THE AD VALOREM PERSONAL PROPERTY AND POLL TAX FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1951-52

Section 1: In order to raise a fund for the general expenses incident to the proper government of the Town of Marion as set forth in the budget, a copy of which is attached hereto, and for the payment of the principal and interest of the bonded indebtedness of the Town, the taxes hereinafter designated are hereby levied for the fiscal year 1951-52.

On every \$100 valuation of real estate within the corporate limits of the Town of Marion as the same existed on the first day of January, 1951, and on every \$100 of personal property owned by persons residing in the corporate limits of the Town of Marion as the same existed on January 1, 1951.

AN ORDINANCE SETTING UP A BUSINESS PRIVILEGE LICENSE TAX FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1951-52

In addition to the tax on property and polls, as otherwise provided for, and under the power and authority conferred in the laws of North Carolina, there shall be set up and collected, a privilege license tax for the year 1951-52, on trades, professions, agencies, and other business operations. The said tax to be the same as was adopted for the fiscal year 1950-51, a copy of which is on file in the City Clerk's Office.

The Manager was instructed to have an appraisal made of the City Hall Building and Community Building by an insurance appraiser in order that the Board might determine whether or not it would be necessary to increase the insurance policies on the two buildings.

Mr. Wiatt of the Duke Power Company appeared before the Board and submitted a recommendation as to changes in the street lighting system in order to give more uniform lighting in all sections of town. Upon motion of Alderman Smith, seconded by Alderman Davis, and unanimously voted, these recommendations were adopted. Mr. Wiatt stated that he could start immediately on making these changes but due to the scarcity of materials it might be sometime before the project was completed.

Approval was given for the Manager to attend the International City Managers' Convention to be held at Poland Springs, Maine, in September.

It was decided that the Chief of Police investigate all beggars found on the streets and report to the Mayor, and that only the ones issued a permit by the Mayor would be permitted to beg on the city streets.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was ordered that there would be no parking on the South side of Blue Ridge Street from Henderson Street to Carson Street and no parking on the North side of New Street from Main Street to Garden and no parking on the East side of Garden Street from Court Street to Conley's driveway and to make parallel parking on the West side of Logan Street from Court Street to Henderson Street and that suitable signs designating these changes be erected.

After considerable discussion it was decided that no free parking would be granted to anyone on the parking lot adjoining the Court House with the exception of two places for the Sheriff's Department.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

Section 1. That an ordinance adopted by the Board of Aldermen on the 20th day of May, 1947, entitled "AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO REGULATING TRAFFIC AND THE USE OF THE PUBLIC STREETS OF THE TOWN OF MARION, PRESCRIBING REGULATIONS FOR THE INSTALLATION AND OPERATION OF PARKING METERS" be amended as follows:

(1) That Section 10 of said ordinance be stricken out and the following inserted in lieu thereof:

"It shall be unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this ordinance for any person to deface, injure, tamper with, open or attempt to open, or wilfully break, destroy or impair the usefulness of any parking meter installed under the provisions of this ordinance, as amended, or to take or attempt to take therefrom any money. Any person violating the provisions of this section of said ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be subject to a fine of \$50.00 or imprisonment for thirty (30) days."

(2) That Section 13 of said ordinance be stricken out and the following inserted in lieu thereof:

"Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of any amount not exceeding \$5.00 for each offense. Provided: That this section shall not apply to any person violating Section 10, as amended, of this ordinance, and any person violating said section shall be punished as provided therein."

(3) That a new section to be numbered "Section 24" be inserted in said ordinance immediately after "Section 2" of same and reading as follows:

"That the Mayor, with the consent and approval of the Board of Aldermen, is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to acquire by purchase or lease lands in the Town of Marion to be used as a municipal parking lot, and to purchase and install meters and to operate said parking lot or lots under the provisions of this ordinance."

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect to be in force from and after its adoption.

The Board of Aldermen met in a regular meeting Tuesday, October 2nd, 1951, with the following members present, C.F. Goldsmith, Mayor, Alderman Otis L. Broyhill, W. Ray Smith, and C. Clarence Wise; absent were Aldermen D. Pat Davis and W.F. Grant. Also present was Mr. R.W. Proctor, Town Attorney.

The Manager was instructed to talk with Sgt. Johnny Hall, the Army Recruiting Officer, about removing recruiting signs from the sidewalks.

The question of granting extended Right-of-Way to Duke Power Company across the new sewage disposal plant property was discussed, and it was decided to ask that the clause be struck from the Right-of-Way Agreement.

The City Attorney turned over a check from Mr. Barron Caldwell for the principal amount of old taxes due, and it was agreed to give Mr. Caldwell credit on the back years for this amount including principal and interest and notify him of the balance due.

It was agreed that the sewer line be run to homes near the Reservoir. It was also agreed to put in storm sewer in an open ditch at the rear of the Henderson Apartments.

It was decided to mail out 1951 tax notices immediately.

Dr. Geo. Rowe had requested that the Town forgive tap fees for water and sewer running to his property where he is now building. It was the opinion of the Board that this would be unusual and that they felt that they could not set a **sequence** of forgiving such tap fees.

Mr. M. W. Gordon, Jr. appeared before the Board in behalf of the County Commissioners and asked that the Board consider designating two parking spaces in the Court House Parking Lot and that they consider a monthly fee of \$3.00 for each parking space. This request was granted.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
